



The Indianapolis Museum of Art Expansion Indianapolis, Indiana

The \$74 million expansion will increase the size of the IMA's facility by more than 160,000 square feet in areas such as galleries, art support spaces, banquet, café and fine dining spaces, a museum gift store, education and outreach spaces and an oval entry pavilion.

The project includes three new pavilions. The new Gallery Pavilion, located directly east of the existing museum, has a cast-in-place concrete frame with shearwalls. The Special Events Pavilion, located northeast of the Gallery Pavilion, has a structural steel frame. The Entry Pavilion, or Rotunda, has an exposed structural steel frame with a glass curtain wall system and is located south of the Gallery Pavilion. A new underground parking garage, with landscaping above, is located east of the new pavilions and is connected with an underground tunnel to the Rotunda
